TechnoServe is a leader in harnessing the power of the private sector to help people lift themselves out of poverty. A nonprofit organization operating in 29 countries, we work with enterprising men and women in the developing world to build competitive farms, businesses and industries. By linking people to information, capital and markets, we have helped millions to create lasting prosperity for their families and communities. TechnoServe has earned a 4-star rating from independent evaluator Charity Navigator for the last 10 years, placing us in the top 1 percent of all its rated nonprofits. With nearly 50 years of proven results, TechnoServe believes in the power of private enterprise to transform lives.

Despite India's strong economic growth in industries such as services and information technology, more than 300 million Indians still live in poverty, with two-thirds depending on agriculture for their livelihood, mostly at a small-scale or subsistence level. Our work is rooted in the idea that given the opportunity, hardworking men and women in even the poorest places can contribute economically to their families and communities. Present in India since 2007, we:

STRENGTHEN VALUE CHAINS: We enable smallholder farmers to grow high-value products, engage with private-sector companies, and sell to profitable markets.

FOSTER SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP: We provide business training and skills development to people in poor communities who want to create sustainable enterprises.

PROMOTE SUSTAINABLE LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: We increase incomes in target communities and in turn further catalyze economic and social development.

SUPPORT GENDER-INCLUSIVE COMMUNITIES: We integrate custom support for women into our programs to expand their capacity and opportunity for sustainable livelihoods.

TechnoServe India partners with international development organizations and grant-making foundations to execute large-scale, multi-year programs, with staff deployed at the frontlines. We also associate with multinational and Indian firms to directly implement customized Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) programs based on our core areas of expertise.

In 2016, TechnoServe provided agronomic training and support to almost 90,000 smallholder farmers, by working directly with more than 14,000 farmers on capacity building and indirectly with 75,000 farmers through farmer producer organizations, across 8 states in India.

OUR HISTORY

American businessman Ed Bullard traveled to Ghana with his family in 1963 for a year of volunteer service. Ed was captivated by the spirit of the Ghanaian people, but appalled by the depth of poverty. In 1968, he launched TechnoServe with a vision to create a different kind of nonprofit, one that would connect poor people to information and market opportunities.

Transferring Indian Innovations to Africa



Under USAID's Feed the Future India-Africa Agriculture and Natural Resource Management Innovation Sharing Platform TechnoServe is developing a demand-led innovation transfer mechanism to connect Indian innovators and African adopters. Over three years TechnoServe has:

- Transferred and piloted four agricultural innovations from India to Kenya and Malawi
- The innovations include Seepage Wells, Nadis & Johads, Fodder & Cattle Management and enabling network for availability of certified seeds

Promoting Sustainable Guar in Rajasthan



In partnership with Solvay, L'Oreal and Hichem, TechnoServe is demonstrating and refining scalable actions for inclusive, sustainable growth and competitiveness of the Guar market system in India. Key aspects of the program:

- Achieve a 25% increase in guar farming revenues for 1500 participating households
- Promote groundwater-neutral best practices to create greater environmental awareness
- Integration of gender approaches in relevant aspects to address to gender dynamics and constraints among guar farming households

Livelihoods Support Program in Karnataka



Maize is a key crop in Davangere district of Karnataka for 80% small and marginal farmers, yet these farmers face various challenges. In partnership with Cargill, TechnoServe is implementing a livelihoods support program for 5,000 smallholder farming households in the Davangere district. Key elements include:

- Agriculture Development & Diversification
- Livelihood opportunities developed for the youth of the farming households through the Agri Fellow Program
- Economic empowerment opportunities for the women of the farming households

Development of Climate Smart Agriculture (CSA)



TechnoServe would work with 9000 farmers (30% to be women) directly in Madhya Pradesh with focus on creating an enabling environment to adopt CSA practices and promote better value chain participation.

In addition, support to FPCs would also be support in creating 30 Centers of Excellence (COEs), thereby improving their business operations and access to various value-added services such as rent-based mechanization, seeds, milling and other various inputs.

Access to Finance for Women Entrepreneurs

TechnoServe is working with Goldman Sachs on a pilot project, aimed at creating and improving access to finance (A2F) for small women entrepreneurs, engaged in agri and allied businesses. Given that A2F for women-led businesses is a priority area for Goldman Sachs in India, this program in Bihar will serve as an effective testing ground to understand the challenges faced by women-led, agri/ allied businesses, in the rural context. The goal of this project is to improve the livelihood of rural households and to promote greater gender equity by promoting rural women entrepreneurship. The intended outcome of the project is to increase A2F to rural women entrepreneurs.

Advancing Women's Leadership in Cotton

TechnoServe, in partnership with Visa Inc. and GAP is implementing a year-long program in Khargone and Bharwani districts of Madhya Pradesh to demonstrate an economically feasible model for the cultivation of cotton. The goal of this program is to improve the livelihoods of rural families by advancing women's leadership in cotton farming communities.

Through this program, we would be working with women farmers to improve access to markets through a value chain intervention through women-led FPCs, also improve financial inclusion and access to finance for these women farmers and train women on concepts of leadership and personal development.

Empowering Women Entrepreneurs

TechnoServe is working on a business accelerator program for women entrepreneurs in Bangalore in partnership with Intuit, a global business and financial management software company.

The accelerator program, planned for eighteen months, is aimed at 20 growth-constrained, women-led, revenue earning small businesses. These 20 women entrepreneurs will be pre-screened prior to selection. The program intends to help scale up the businesses of these participating entrepreneurs. The women entrepreneurs will undergo business and financial management training along with access to a business advisory council.

Strengthening the Dairy Value Chain

Abbott Nutrition is opening new supply chains in India to meet growing demand. Abbott has teamed up with TechnoServe to improve the quantity and quality of milk available, while improving farmer livelihoods and income. While it started as a pilot in Sept '14 for a six-month engagement, it is still being continued till date. Here TechnoServe is:

- Working with more than 1500 farmers to provide good quality milk on a daily basis and also creating incremental income for the farmers
- Created village level entrepreneurs to be a part of the dairy value chain as collection centers to reach maximize efficiency
- Creating a sustainable dairy supply chain alongside bringing farmers under the organized dairy industry

Strengthening Women's Farmer Groups in Bihar

On successful completion of Phase I and II, a three year program titled 'Women's Advancement in Rural Development & Agriculture' (WARDA) program is being implemented with the World Bank-funded Bihar Transformative Development Project in close coordination with JEEViKA (under the aegis of the Government of Bihar), with the support of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

WARDA develops approaches for graduating women smallholder farmers out of poverty through market-led Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs). The program provides technical assistance to producer groups and facilitates producer group formation with the aim of empowering rural women and improving their lives and communities.



Youth Skills, Careers and Employability in Mumbai

Mumbai has one of the largest concentrations of young people in Asia, with a large share living in slums with few employment opportunities. In partnership with the Citi Foundation, TechnoServe is conducting a program to impact 4 major barriers faced by youth in developing countries – lack of information, soft and technical skill gaps, limited access to gainful employment and being ill-equipped with tools for success in job search. TechnoServe is:

- Delivering soft skills training to 1,250 urban youth to improve their job readiness and placing them in jobs
- Providing career guidance and pre-employment counseling to access jobs in high growth industries.



Developing Commodity Value Chain and Market Linkages

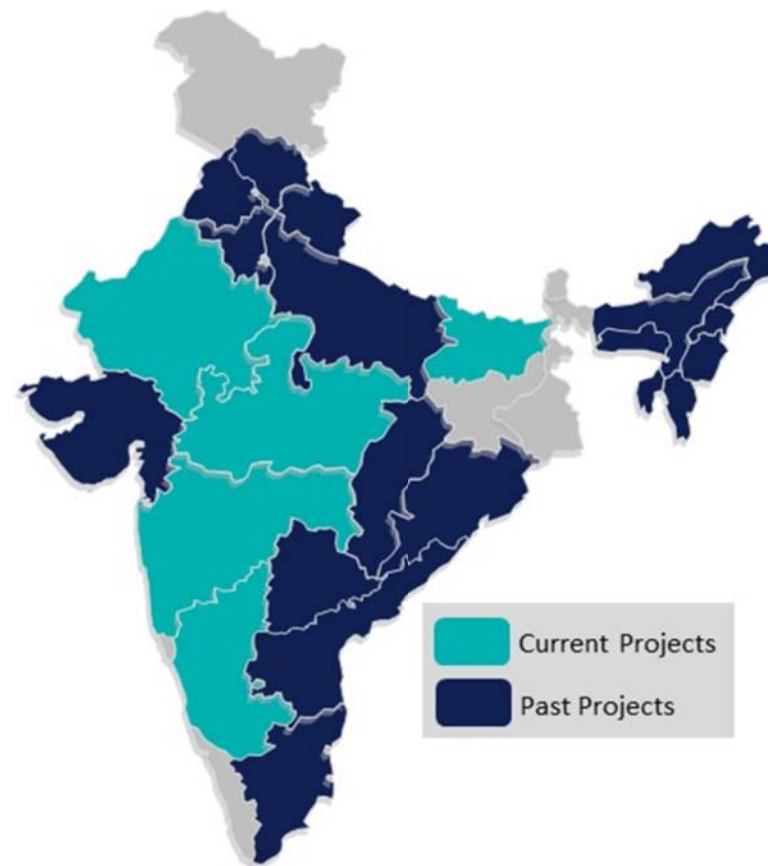
TechnoServe is a designated Technical Support Agency (TSA) for the National Rural Livelihoods Promotion Society (NRLPS) with the mandate to set up Value Chain Support Cell (VCSC) to provide technical assistance and capacity-building support to participating State Rural Livelihood Missions (SRLMs) in the development of commodity value chains and market linkages in the Agriculture and Allied, Livestock and Non-Timber Forest Products (NTFP) sub-sectors. The VCSC provides technical assistance and handholding support to SRLMs in developing projects within these sectors that are profitable, bankable, and self-sustaining in the long run.



Barmer Unnati in Rajasthan

The Barmer district of Rajasthan is one of the most remote and underdeveloped regions of India. In partnership with Cairn India, TechnoServe promoted social and economic development in the district through:

- Training 10,000 farmers across 140 villages in agri-livelihoods designed to improve productivity and increase incomes
- Building and scaling up tested models of water management and land use at 1,010 sites across the district
- Training 30 rural youths as Cairn Agri-Fellows and helping them find jobs and start agri-businesses.
