TechnoServe Honored by Visit from President Obama

TechnoServe is proud to have been honored by a visit from

President Barack Obama late July. As part of the first ever visit by a sitting U.S. president to the country, Obama toured the Faffa Food Share Company plant in Addis Ababa and learned about

our work with Partners in Food Solutions (PFS) supported by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).

"We want Ethiopia not only to be able to feed itself, eventually we want Ethiopia to be a food exporter as well," President Obama said on the floor of the Faffa plant.

Faffa is one of 20 food companies across Ethiopia receiving technical advice and business guidance from TechnoServe and PFS. With our combined support, food companies are able to produce more affordable, high-quality food for the local market, improving the nutrition of Ethiopian families and sustaining the demand for crops grown by Ethiopian farmers.

The Faffa plant is Ethiopia's leading producer of baby food for children over six months, and it is also a major source of fortified flour and foods, some of which it supplies to the World Food Program.

Over five years and across five African countries, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Tanzania and Zambia, PFS and TechnoServe have worked with 700 food companies, helping to create a sustainable market for 829,000 smallholder farmers and supporting nearly 5 million people!

"We are honored to host the first visit by a sitting U.S. President to Ethiopia," said Zeko Kassim, Faffa Food Share CEO. "From the beginning of the company, we have tried to fight the debilitating effect of malnutrition on Ethiopian children by producing low-cost, high-protein weaning food and supporting nutrition for children and families, so we are fundamentally aligned with President Obama's Feed the Future Inititiative. Our partnership with USAID, PFS and TechnoServe is helping to substantially improve our quality and boost our growth."

Mumbai Youth Improve Workforce Readiness

When Noorjahan Ansari first joined TechnoServe's newest youth initiative in India – The Youth

Employability Program (YEP) she was shy and introverted. By the end of the one-year program, she blossomed into a leader amongst her peers. Impressing trainers and her fellow participants with her planning methods and presentation skills, Noorjahan is now aspiring to become a teacher!

A partnership between Techno-Serve and J. P. Morgan India, YEP increases access to skills, training and employment opportunities for youth living in Mumbai. Targeting disadvantaged youth aged 18-25, YEP has already made its mark in the region — especially the young female population.

The program brings together three important employability levers — skills training, career counseling and job linkages enabling the beneficiaries to take up employment suited to their skills and career aspirations.

Punit Gupta, TechnoServe India Country Director said, "It is imperative that we focus on opportunities for youth in India in order to ensure a stable and prosperous future for our region. With the right support, young people can identify and capitalize on opportunities that will improve their livelihoods and strengthen their communities."

Former Volunteer Becomes Entrepreneur

SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA When Sharon Againe first applied to become a Volunteer Consultant with TechnoServe, she

hoped to learn more about the farming industry in Sub-Saharan Africa. Little did she know that her time as a volunteer would lead her to become founder and CEO of her very own company.

Sharon's volunteer assignment with TechnoServe was analyzing productivity of honey in Mozambique. It was during her field work that she met Verinijo Simajani, a struggling honeybee farmer. With few buyers nearby, he lost close to 5,000 liters of honey each year. Sharon listened to him share his frustrations, how he traveled to nearby towns and spent days looking for customers, all while spending money on travel, accommodations and

meals. The solution: reliable customer contacts.

Sharon's entrepreneurial spirit and desire to help others lead her to found AgaSha Group upon completing her volunteer assignment. AgaSha Group connects farmers like Verinijo with customer networks to boost sales. Today, AgaSha Group works in six East African countries — Uganda, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Burundi and will soon expand to South Sudan. In her own words, "I decided to become a social entrepreneur with a business that has a direct, positive impact on the livelihoods of smallholder farmers.

For almost 15 years, TechnoServe Volunteer Consultants like Sharon have made a tremendous impact on farmers living in underdeveloped countries throughout Africa, India, Latin America and the Caribbean. Our program not only helps those we serve, but our local youth as well instilling philanthropic values and empowering them to help others. We are proud to have engaged more than 900 Volunteer Consultants and look forward to introducing you to our new class of volunteers in the months to come.


Are these benefits lasting?
