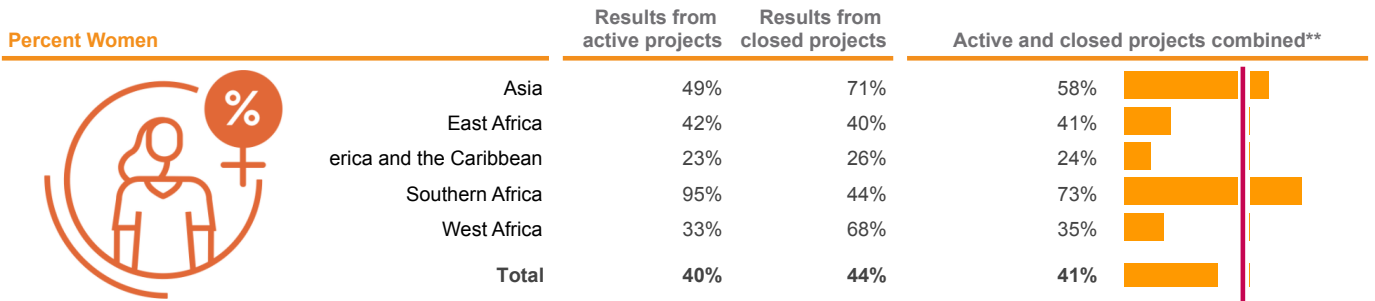
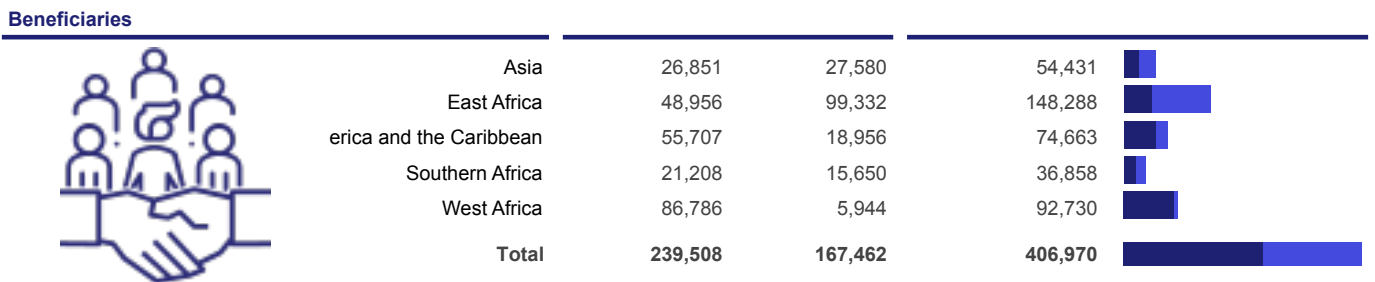
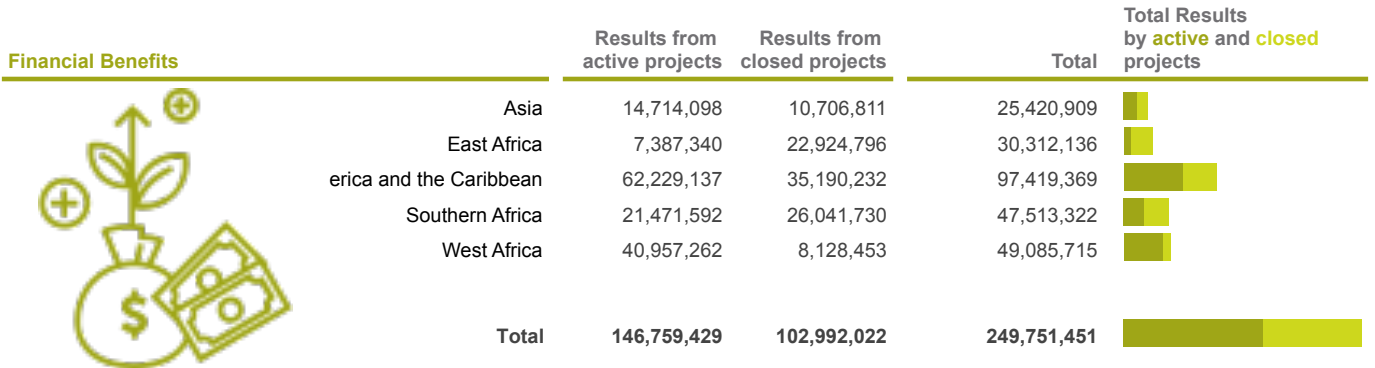
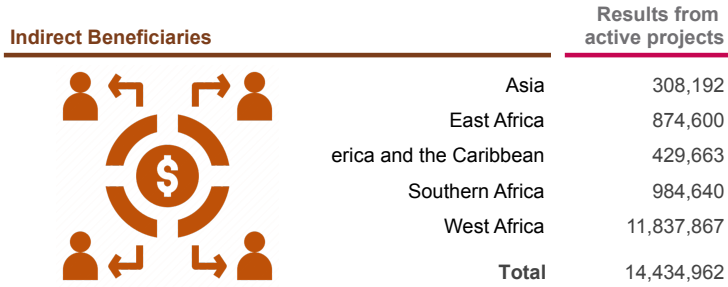
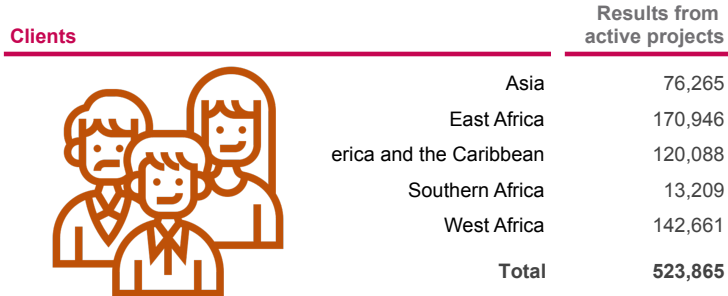
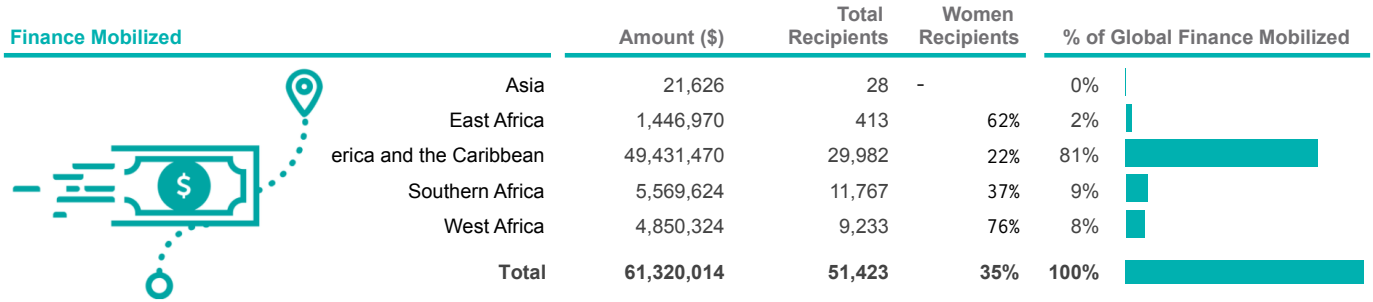


TechnoServe's Impact - Breakdown by Region
