Background and Objective

TechnoServe is a leader in harnessing the power of the private sector to help people improve their livelihoods. A nonprofit founded in 1968 and operating in 26 countries, we work with enterprising women and men in the developing world to build competitive farms, businesses, and industries. By linking people to information, capital, and markets, we have helped millions to create lasting prosperity for their families and communities. For 12 years, TechnoServe has worked extensively with food processors and other agricultural intermediaries in Sub-Saharan Africa to grow their businesses by deploying commercially-viable, inclusive business models that create markets for smallholder farmers (SHFs) and jobs for workers, while supplying safe and nutritious food for consumers. These firms are the linchpin of food systems, and their growth, particularly those that are farmer-allied (strategically investing in smallholder productivity and livelihoods) is critical to unlocking the potential of Africa's agricultural sector and building inclusive, resilient food systems. Since 2010, TechnoServe has provided customized technical assistance to over 400 processors, strengthened markets for over 1 million SHFs, helped create over 1,200 processor jobs, and contributed to 7.2 million MT of new/improved nutritious foods sold across 10 countries in sub-Saharan Africa.

A flagship program of TechnoServe's Food Processing Practice is the Alliance for Inclusive Food Processing (AINFP), a USAID award working with Partners in Food Solutions (PF) and Initiative for Smallholder Finance (ISF) Advisors. Whilst the program has a set of core indicators it is tracking, the ability to effectively measure and attribute impact is often complicated and difficult. Food processing has impacts across the value chain, both upstream and downstream and there are limitations for gathering data and assessing attribution. While several industry players have published metrics and methodologies they use, the approaches are varied and often fall short. **The objectives of this consultancy are to:**

- 1. Strengthen AINFP's ability to measure impact, particularly around nutrition and economic well-being, and contribute to TechnoServe's corporate metrics
- To help TechnoServe better tell our story about the impact of our food processing work, conduct a landscape review of existing measurement approaches and produce recommendations for indicators and measurement approaches best suited for the AINFP program and similar food processing interventions.
- Provide, on a pilot or snap-shot scale, an assessment of AINFP's work to date, using identified measurement approaches, and a framework for AINFP to conduct a full internal formative evaluation.

Consultant Tasks

- Support the formative evaluation of the AINFP program through identifying a sound methodology, conducting a pilot evaluation, and providing a framework for AINFP to conduct a more thorough internal evaluation
- Conduct a desk review of published methodologies, existing best practices, and standard indicators
- Interview key stakeholders among donors (BMGF, USAID Center for Nutrition), internal (project leaders, MEL staff), and external partners (GAIN, PSF, NI, etc.)

- Produce recommendations for indicators and impact measurement approaches best suited for the AINFP program and similar food processing programs.
- Recommend an evaluation methodology that would be feasible in ascertaining program attribution. The recommended approach should be one that is scalable.
- Identify a country or program area in which to pilot test the evaluation methodology, and provide a framework for AINFP to conduct a full program formative evaluation.
- Spend 2-3 weeks in Nairobi, Kenya at TechnoServe's Kenya Office, working closely with the AINFP M&E Manager and other project staff to understand the challenges and operational context, ground truth findings, and produce detailed recommendations.

Deliverables

Desk/Landscape Review

- Compilation of all potential indicators, with an assessment of potential fit for TechnoServe
- Compilation of existing methodologies, organized in a framework that assesses the resources required compared to benefits (e.g. precision, insightfulness, breadth).
- Summary of learning agendas from key donors, with an assessment of key trends, alignment with TechnoServe's interests, and future direction.

Final Report and Recommendations

- AINFP pilot/snap-shot formative assessment report, with findings, lessons learned, and recommendations
- Recommended standard indicators, including measurement practices for both routine tracking/reporting, as well as period deep-dive evaluation. Recommendations should balance logistical considerations and needs for highest attainable rigor and alignment with donor interests. Metrics need to be credible and respectable for the results they intend to represent
- Framework for AINFP to conduct an internal formative evaluation
- Standard MEL Plan for new projects to follow
- Donor communication guidance
- MIS System recommendations

Qualifications

- Significant professional experience in development program Monitoring, Evaluation, and Learning (MEL)
- Strong knowledge of nutrition metrics (both economics and attribution)
- Excellent analytical skills, both quantitative and qualitative
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills, including the ability to clearly convey information to a variety of audiences
- Proven ability to effectively manage projects and keep them on-track
- Collaborator and team player

- Able to travel to Nairobi, Kenya for 2-3 weeks during the assignment
